The day has finally arrived: Sunday, October 4th, 2020! After months of staying apart during a worldwide pandemic, on this date, United will again gather in our sanctuary for worship.

This time apart has been difficult for all of us. Yet, during it all, we have continued to be the church. Faith, love, creativity, courage, and service have continued to shine through United's community. Here's just some of what has been taking place in our time apart:

1. Worship every Sunday and Wednesday. Musicians, technicians, pastors, a youth director, ushers and the altar guild have all done things in new and creative ways so that we would continue to be a worshipping community. We didn't miss a week! We have shared worship through Facebook live, the radio broadcast, parking lot services, and communion in the courtyard.

I love when people join the service online, posting greetings to one another helping us to remember that although apart we are still a united community in faith, service, and worship.

- 2. United continued to reach out in service to our community. We served hundreds of grab and go lunches in August and collected hundreds of pounds of food in September for the food pantry. Through the generosity of United members, we continued to support campus ministry, ELCA world hunger, disaster relief and many other vital ministries we share with other Lutherans through our Eastern North Dakota synod and our national church body, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
- 3. Education. Spiritual Formation Ministry and our Youth and Family Ministry Director, Molly Haagenson, continued Sunday school, Faith friends, Vacation Bible School, and

Confirmation through online platforms and take home resources. Adult classes continued to meet through Zoom.

4. Pastors made many calls, visited when invited

and allowed at hospitals and care facilities, conducted funerals, baptized, counseled, and prayed.

5. Members continued to faithfully support our congregation financially during this time apart. What a testimony to commitment of our members to live, learn, and share the love of Jesus Christ! The work of God through this congregation continued and thrived because of your faithfulness!

6. Church council. It isn't easy to be an elected leader of a congregation in a pandemic. Members of the church council met regularly, respectfully discussed difficult decisions, listened to experts, and made decisions striving to care for one another's wellbeing and serve God.

I am amazed and thankful for all the ways the Spirit of God has been at work through and among us. But none of it has been easy. You may not have agreed with every decision. It has been stressful and none of us have ever navigated a congregation through a global pandemic.

So, as we come back together, let's give thanks, encourage one another, and do all that we can to build each other up so that we are equipped to be the body of Christ for one another and for the world as we have been called to be. Things will still look very different for a while. But what joy there will be in being together.

As always, your church council members and pastors are open to listening to your ideas and concerns.

It has been an honor and joy to be your pastor through this unique and challenging time. I continue to give thanks for you and for all that we are doing together to live, learn + share the good news of God's love in Jesus with one another and the world.

# Caring for Each Other as We Return to In-Person Worship

On Tuesday September 15, United's Church decided to return to in person worship on Sunday, October 4 at 10:15am in the sanctuary. After some good and thoughtful discussion and after consulting with local health leaders, the council decided on the following plan for return to in person worship. We intend to do our very best to keep everyone safe and well by following the best safety practices that we are aware of at this time. As we said back in July, our return to worship will not be "everything is back to normal".

- 1) We will practice social distancing in our seating arrangements.
- 2) Everyone five years and older will be required to wear masks in the building.
- 3) We will not be shaking hands or hugging.
- 4) We will not be having coffee hour after worship.
- 5) We will be celebrating Holy communion.
- 6) We will not be having an 8:30 am worship for the present as the turnaround time for cleaning before the next service is not sufficient.
- 7) We will have music and song leaders shielded behind a plexiglass screen. However, the congregation will not be singing.
- 8) You will be ushered into your seats as you enter and ushered out as you leave to prevent bunching up at the doorways and in the aisles.
- 9) The balcony will not be in use for the present.
- 10) Please do not attend worship if any of the following are true to you or your family:
  - Obvious illness.
  - Suspicion of getting sick.
  - Contact with someone who has COVID-19.
  - Tested for COVID-19, but have not received results.
  - Consider staying home if you've traveled or attended group gatherings outside your normal contacts.



Here is how we plan to go about this prayer journey:

- 3. On the day we have set aside for you, please know your pastors are intentionally in prayer for you and your household.
- 4. With your permission, we will also name your household in prayer on the upcoming Sunday and list your name(s) in the email and bulletins so that our whole congregation can join us in praying for your family.
- 5. Please remember it will take us most of one year to accomplish this effort.
- 6. Please remember that we will continue to pray for you during times of difficulty, challenge, grief, and illness. You may contact your pastors at any time with prayer requests.

As the body of Christ, a community of believers, we are called to encourage one another. May our prayers offer encouragement during this challenging time and keep us connected, even when we are separated, to God and to one another.

## **Backpack Program**

United Lutheran is stepping up!

Northland Rescue mission runs a city-wide backpack program, delivering weekend take home bags of food for children whose households struggle with food insecurity. They are currently serving several of the Grand Forks elementary schools but their goal is to provide bags for every elementary school in our city so that every child in need of food for the weekend would receive a bag.

United Lutheran Church has been encouraged by the Mission to help with this project. United has been all about helping to feed our neighbors and we think the people of United will want to help.

United's goal is to provide bags of food for one weekend a month to Phoenix Elementary school form December 2020-May 2021 (six months). Phoenix provides 100 bags each weekend and the cost to fill a bag is approximately \$2.50. So, each month, the cost to provide the weekend bag is \$250 or a total of \$1,500 for December 2020—May 2021 school year. Rather than collecting food items, we will be ordering items so that we get the food choices that are in line with school requirements.

We are learning that as this pandemic continues and initial supports are evaporating, the needs are increasing. Our goal is to raise \$1,500 by thanksgiving. Small groups of adults and youth will be invited to pack the weekend bags each month.

We have been waiting for the day when we get to be back with your teenagers! Seriously. We're not kidding.

As you know, this year is going to look a little different. Because of the pandemic, we've decided to postpone Confirmation day for our 10th graders until the spring of 2021.

Confirmation classes for our 6th through 8th graders will be held in the fellowship hall at our usual time on Wednesday evenings at 7:00pm beginning October 7th. The 9th graders will meet in the choir room on Wednesday evenings at 7:00pm, while beginning their mentor program in January. We will provide a physically distant setup, with masks required.

We've decided to switch up our curriculum this year to Sparkhouse Re:form, which will allow for both in-person and online learning. We plan to use Zoom and Google Classroom to stay connected with those at home. We hope to be creative in providing safe service opportunities for our Confirmation youth through worship assisting and community involvement.



We will also offer Youth Group for all high school youth at 8:00pm on Wednesday evenings in the Lounge, also beginning October 7th. We're excited to welcome you back! See you soon.



- Sing and Ring Choir is currently not meeting through September. We will keep you updated when the choir will resume.


