# **Pastors Page**

Beloved people of United Lutheran Church,


We are back once again to worshipping together online and through our radio broadcast only. I am so very grateful for the members of United's Church Council who have brought so much faith, love, insight, and prayer to long meetings as we discussed the best way to move forward. At the church council meeting on Tuesday, November 17, 2020 the church council voted unanimously to suspend all indoor worship services and indoor gatherings at United. The council believes this is the best way for us to love and care for one another and our larger community at this time. We made this decision with the strong encouragement of our Bishop, Rev. Tessa Moon Leiseth, and with the recommendation of our County Public Health Officer, Dr. Joel Walz. Dr. Walz has been so generous in his help to your pastors and church council throughout the pandemic.

We will continue to worship, pray, study, care for one another and serve our neighbors. When we ceased indoor services in March, we also fasted from Holy Communion for a time. Outdoor worship services gave us regular opportunity to share in Holy Communion together this past summer. While one pastor I know boldly stated, "bring your own booze" when advertising their congregation's first online only worship, I tend to take a more careful approach. I took a deep dive again into thinking about Holy Communion. It seemed to me that fasting from the meal for a time gave us valuable time to consider the importance of this meal and consider Christ's presence with us at our everyday tables. Holy Communion is a table where all are welcome, yet discrepancies exist and not everyone has access the Lord's table when taking part in the meal is dependent on the technology in our homes. Holy Communion is a community meal where we are fed in order to be the body of Christ in the world. It must not become a private devotional time. The communal nature of this meal seemed most fully realized when we are gathered in assembly together.

However the ongoing nature of this time apart makes it important for us to celebrate Holy Communion together even when we are separated. Pr. Bradley Schelming of Gloria Dei Lutheran Church in St. Paul, said it well in a letter to his congregation:

"While virtual community may not hold all the nuance, depth and power that an assembly of the faithful does on Sunday morning, it most certainly is the way that the body of Christ is being truly present to one another in this moment".

Certainly we are present to one another in this time and Christ is present with us. Jesus will meet us in the bread and wine of this meal, even in this time of separation, bringing us forgiveness and new life and equipping us to be the body of Christ for the sake of the world.



I encourage you to set up a worship space in your home if you have not already done so. Perhaps light some candles or set out a tablecloth. During advent you may want to light your advent wreath or the advent candle you received in your "Advent at Home" packet. Make a space much as you would if you were hosting a special guest, which of course you are—Christ Jesus. It doesn't matter what kind —

of bread or wine or juice you use. If your buy or bake a loaf of bread you can eat the rest for lunch that day. If you are worshipping at home with others, distribute it to one another. Say, "The Body of Christ, given for you," and "The blood of Christ shed for you." If you live by yourself, we will include words in the online service where one of the worship leaders says these same words for you while you eat and drink. This way, all of us receive this wonderful gift together.

It is my hope and prayer that as we share this meal together in our homes, our hearts will find strength and our faith will be renewed. We long for the day when we may gather again and celebrate this meal together. In the meantime, we trust that Christ is truly present for us, in bread and in wine, and in one another.

## **Good Gifts Christmas Fair Online**

Good News for Good Gifts!

Yes, we WILL be having the Annual Good Gifts Christmas fair this year, but it will not be taking place in the fellowship hall. Ordering gifts from the fair can be done between December 2-27, 2020, with either a paper order form and check, or online. Cards and inserts describing each gift are available in the church office and can be mailed out or printed when you order online.



More good news – the United Lutheran Church Foundation will contribute \$5,000 to the fair!

Since we will not be gathering together and visiting at the fair this year, here are some brief descriptions of the gifts available:

- <u>Hospital Gifts</u> These include surgery and pos-op recovery support for children, oxygen for hospitalized COVID-19 patients, and hospice daycare support. These patients are served through Selian Lutheran Hospital in Tanzania. Dr. Mark & Linda Jacobson have built up this medical ministry over the past 3 (+) decades.
- <u>Nursing School Gifts</u> Gifts can be given to Arusha Lutheran Medical Centre School of Nursing for their building fund or scholarships. They are currently in the process of building and have already educated several classes of much needed nurses.
- <u>Moringe Sokoine Secondary School</u> located in Monduli, Tanzania has many needs for supplies, scholarships, and staff support.
- <u>Phoenix Elementary, Grand Forks</u> Our neighbor across the street! Your gift goes to the principal's fund where it is used to help children and families in need.
- <u>Church Gifts</u> The Lutheran Church is growing in Tanzania! Last year we were asked to support a new church being built in Orng'oswa Village near Monduli. Our gifts helped them start a church. They are still in need of a floor, windows, chairs, and solar power. Let's help them finish this year!
- <u>ELCA Good Gifts</u> Maybe everyone's favorite God's Global Barnyard! Who wouldn't love to give a goat to your friend for Christmas? Or a flock of chicks for a mere \$10? Better yet, these gifts are often matched through the ELCA, so your gift may be matched!
- <u>South Sudan Lutheran Ministry Gifts</u> South Sudan Mission Project--\$50 share in support of the Reconciliation Lutheran Church Mission Center and Primary Healthcare Facility where the Spiritual and health needs of the community are being met in the world's youngest nation of south Sudan.

# **COVID Response Team**

As the number of Covid cases in our county and city increase, there is an increasing need for support for those who are sick, quarantined, or homebound. United Lutheran Church is creating a Covid response team to care for those who need assistance. We are looking for volunteers to help in the following ways:

- 1. Check in and assess needs. Each volunteer will be paired with an individual or household where people are sick, quarantined, or homebound. The volunteer will call and check in on their assigned household to see what they need. As United's pastors and staff become aware of needs, they will contact volunteers.
- **2. Deliver a care package.** Care packages will be available through the church office. The care packages will include helpful items (Gatorade, tea, crackers, etc).
- **3. Shop.** Covid response volunteers would also shop for any needed items and deliver them to your assigned household. Gift cards for needed items will also be available through the church office.
- **4. Cooking meals.** We are hoping to create a pool of volunteers who will provide a meal to be delivered to a household in need.
- **5. Donate gift cards.** Gift cards (\$25-\$50) will be used to shop for needed items or given to household so they can order meals when people are not able to cook.



**No contact.** All deliveries are to be made without ever entering a home or coming into contact with people.

This is a difficult illness that impacts people in many ways. Because people are quarantined when they have this illness, it is difficult to get what they need. Consider for example, a college student, miles from home, quarantined by themselves in a hotel room for 10 days. Or a family with several people are ill and no one can leave the house. Or people with a pre-existing conditions that are frightened to get out and don't have a support system in our community.

Pastor Peter and Pastor Karla will be available to provide support and pastoral care as well as to assist volunteers with any concerns or advice.


